COACHING STAFF



Keith Byrnes
Head Coach

Keith Byrnes enters his fourth season as head coach of the Frostburg State men's soccer program. Byrnes has led the Bobcats to a 29-24-6 overall record, including a 13-7-1 mark in the Allegheny Mountain Collegiate Conference.

Traditionally, the Bobcats have opened the season against some of the toughest teams in the nation. Last year, after starting 1-3, including a loss to No. 9 St. Lawrence, FSU gained momentum going 6-1-1. The Bobcats started AMCC action 3-0 before injuries took their toll and the team finished with a 5-3-1 league mark. FSU earned the No. 4 seed in the AMCC Tournament and downed rival Penn State Behrend 3-1 in the first round. The Bobcats then lost to eventual champion Pitt-Greensburg 2-1 in the semifinals to finish the year 11-8-2.

In his second season, the Bobcats overcame a rough start before hitting their stride en route to a 10-7-2 finish, including a 5-1 mark in the AMCC. After suffering three one-goal losses to open the season, FSU hit its stride in a 9-1-2 stretch and was ranked as high as seventh in the NCAA Mid-Atlantic Region poll and eighth in the NSCAA regional poll.

The Bobcats tied for the AMCC regular-season title, were the runners-up in the AMCC Tournament and advanced to the ECAC Tournament for the 14th time in school history. Five FSU players were named to the All-AMCC team, including senior Mike Mutchler, who was also selected to the NSCAA/adidas Mid-Atlantic Regional All-America second team.

In his first year at the helm, Byrnes led the Bobcats to an 8-9-2 overall record and a 3-3 mark in the AMCC. After struggling to find the net in an 0-3-2 start, Byrnes' squad went on a tear, winning eight of its next 11, including a season-high five in a row. FSU, which suffered four one-goal losses, had six All-AMCC selections.

Byrnes came to Frostburg after a two-year stint as the part-time head coach at Plymouth State (N.H.) College, where he led the Panthers to a 29-11 overall record and a pair of post-season appearances.

In his first season at Plymouth State, Byrnes guided the Panthers to Little East Conference regular-season and tournament championships and a berth in the NCAA Division III Tournament. PSC advanced to the second round and finished with a 15-5 overall record.

Byrnes then led the Panthers to a 14-6 overall mark in 2001, finishing as the runner-up in the LEC and winning the ECAC New England Tournament Championship.

Plymouth State earned strong regional and national rankings under Byrnes, and the Panthers boasted the Little East Conference Player of the Year in both 2000 and 2001.

A 1995 graduate of Plattsburgh State (N.Y.), where he played four years for the Cardinals, Byrnes was an assistant coach at his alma mater for one season before serving as an assistant coach at Norwich University for two years. He helped Norwich win a school-record 17 games in 1999, capture the Great Northeast Athletic Conference and advance to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Byrnes' career as a player included three NCAA Tournament appearances and two State University of New York Athletic Conference championships. He was also a SUNYAC All-Academic Team selection all four years.

Byrnes has his national license from the NSCAA and his "B" license from the USSF. He has also been very active in the local community as he is the Co-Director of Frostburg State Soccer Camps and is the Head Coach for the Far West Region of the Maryland State Youth Soccer Associations District Development Program.



John Witkowski
Assistant Coach

John Witkowski enters his fourth year as the assistant coach of the Frostburg State men's soccer program.

Witkowski, a four-year letterwinner at Hartwick, played for the legendary Jim Lennox in one of the top Division I programs in the country. Witkowski earned numerous academic honors, including the Philip S. Wilder, Jr. Award for Academic Distinction three years in a row.

A former forward and midfielder, Witkowski serves as coordinator of the FSU Soccer Camp and is the head coach of the Bobcats' jayvee team. He is also an associate professor in the FSU Health, Physical Education and Recreation department.

Witkowski earned bachelor's degrees in both business management and accounting as well as minors in economics, finance and religious studies from Hartwick in May 2002. He is a member of both the NSCAA and USSF and holds the NSCAA Advanced National, National and Goalkeeping Advanced Level II diplomas.

Witkowski, who completed his master's degree in human performance from Frostburg State in December 2004, is involved with the Maryland Youth Soccer Association as a District Development Coach.

EXPERIENCED BOBCATS LOOK FOR AMCC CHAMPIONSHIP

After losing just four seniors in 2004, the Frostburg State men's soccer team returns 14 players and a wealth of experience to this year's lineup as it tries to improve on its 11-8-2 overall record and fourth-place finish a season ago.

Offensively, the Bobcats return all four strikers in seniors **Matt Moffa** (Baltimore, Md./Eastern Tech) and **Kodjo Gnatiko** (Montgomery Village, Md./Montgomery Blair), junior **Jeff Bisker** (Fallston, Md./Fallston) and sophomore **Trevor Havey** (Eldersburg, Md./Liberty).

Moffa and Havey will lead the Bobcat attack and should battle to become the league's best scoring tandem, while Bisker and Gnatiko are added weapons with their speed and aggressive play.

Moffa, a two-time first-team all-conference selection, returns after leading the Bobcats and finishing sixth in the conference with 10 goals. He scored a pair of goals in four games, highlighted by his two-goal performance in the opening round of the AMCC Tournament against rival Penn State Behrend.

Havey earned second-team All-AMCC honors after a stellar freshman campaign in which he tied for the team lead with 22 points on eight goals and six assists. He tied for seventh in the league in goals and also tied for fifth in assists. His best game came against Pitt-Bradford when he scored one goal and added two assists in a 6-0 victory.

Gnatiko scored three goals and added one assist last season. He is a speedster with a great left foot and has the ability to break down defenses by himself.

Bisker returns after scoring three goals and adding one assist last fall. He always plays in control and relies on his quickness to create opportunities.

FSU is also solid in the midfield where junior **Sean Quealy** (Massapequa Park, N.Y./Massapequa) and sophomores **Eric Whisman** (Severn, Md./Glen Burnie), **Kenny Dotter** (Baltimore, Md./Sparrows Point) and **Bryan Lee** (Silver Spring, Md./St. Vincent Pallotti) all combined for 35 starts a year ago.

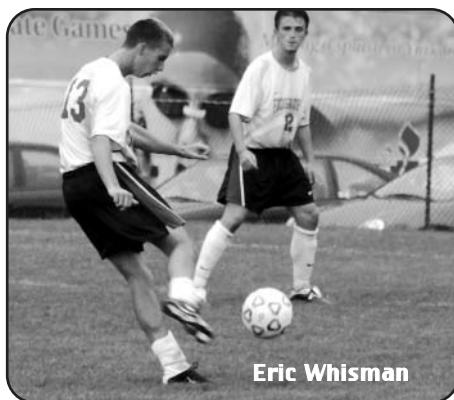
Quealy possesses a good work rate and is FSU's feistiest defender. He notched two goals and two assists last year and the coaches look for more production from him on the outside this season.

Whisman is coming off a great freshman year during which he tied for the team lead and tied for fifth in the AMCC with six assists. He will be the focal point of the Bobcat attack.

Dotter is the third returning Bobcat to garner all-conference honors after earning an honorable mention selection in 2004. He tied for second on the squad with eight goals and was one of just two players to see action in every game. However, he moves to the midfield after being a striker last year. He has the quickest feet on the team and can attack the goal from anywhere.

Lee scored two goals in 17 games last season. He has worked on his confidence and has the potential to be a top goal scorer and should fight for a starting spot.

Looking to make contributions will be transfers **Sean Tana** (Baldwin, Md./Loyola Blakefield) and **Gregg Laskow** (Plainsboro,

N.J./WWP-North) along with freshman **Sean Jones** (Pasadena, Md./Severna Park).

Tana, a transfer from North Carolina Wesleyan, is a playmaker with great vision. He creates scoring opportunities and has a good work rate on defense.

Laskow, a transfer from Rider, is a strong physical defender who possesses a natural instinct to attack the goal.

Jones is a physical defender with a relentless work ethic and solid technical ability.

On defense, the Red and Black return three starters to a unit that held opponents to a stingy 1.48 goals against average.

Senior captain **Wyatt Sagers** (La Plata, Md./La Plata) netted three goals last season and is the vocal leader who helps keep the team organized.

Junior **Steve Zoutman** (Chester, N.Y./Goshen) had one assist last year and is the most offensive-minded defender on the team. His attacking ability creates matchup problems for opposing defenders.

Sophomore **Greg Mason** (Ewing, N.J./Ewing) played in all 21 games last season, making 17 starts. He is the most consistent player in the back and has developed the ability to attack from his defender position.

Sophomore **Andrew Appelbaum** (Severn, Md./Old Mill) is back after suffering an injury that cut his season short in 2004. He reads the game well and can anticipate where the strikers are at all times.

Three newcomers will battle for playing time on defense as well – junior **Matt Lovelace** (Chesapeake Beach, Md./Frederick Douglass) and freshmen **Joe Norton** (Baltimore, Md./Mount St. Joseph) and **Adam Gracia** (Rockville, Md./Thomas Wootton).

Lovelace, a transfer from Prince George's Community College, is a quick and tenacious defender who tracks players down well.

Norton is one of the toughest workers on the team and is a true defender who plays hard and challenges for every ball.

Gracia is an impact player with solid technical skills. He has the ability to create instant offense from the back.

Senior **Bryn Varhol** (Alexandria, Va./Bishop O'Connell) and senior **Derek Richardson** (New Windsor, Md./Linganore) should hold

down the net, while freshman **Jay Herford** (Crofton, Md./South River) will learn the FSU system under their tutelage.

Varhol started nine games, going 4-5-1 with a 1.81 GAA while posting shutouts of Clarkson, Wilkes and Division II Pitt-Johnstown. He recorded 52 saves, including a season-high 13 against Penn State Behrend in the opening round of the AMCC Tournament.

Richardson started five games last season going 2-2 with a 1.80 GAA. His only shutout came in a 2-0 Bobcat victory over Penn State Behrend.

Herford is a hard worker who will spend much of the season learning the system. He is regarded as the future in goal for FSU.

The Frostburg State schedule will once again challenge the team right from the start. The Bobcats open the season at the Lycoming Tournament with games against regionally strong opponents Susquehanna (11-6-1) and Lycoming (14-5-1).

FSU also squares off against Richard Stockton (18-4-3), which advanced to the Elite Eight in 2004.

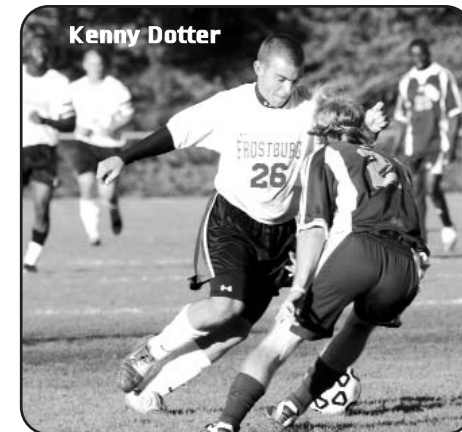
"This game will be a good test to see where we stack up against nationally ranked teams," said Byrnes.

The Bobcats will also face regional teams Bethany, Mary Washington and Gettysburg.

In the AMCC, FSU is fourth in the preseason poll with Penn State

Altoona slated in the top spot. Defending champion Pitt-Greensburg and Penn State Behrend occupy the second and third spots, respectively.

"It's going to be a dog fight with the league being more competitive this season than last," said Byrnes. "We have a strong core of returners and we expect to compete for the conference title."

Bobcats Spend Week in Scotland

Frostburg State geared up for the 2005 season with a nine-day trip to Scotland in August that included training and matches. The Bobcats started off strong with a pair of 2-1 victories over the Queens Park youth team (a Scottish professional club with a youth team comprised of mostly 17 and 18-year olds waiting to be called up to the first team) and the Kilpatrick Amateurs (an adult team comprised of players ranging from ages 19 to 35).

The Bobcats then dropped a 5-0 decision to Campsie Blackwatch (a U-21 amateur team with several players who were released from professional clubs) before closing out the trip with a 6-0 loss to the semi-professional team Greenock Juniors.

"We played well the first two games when our legs were fresh and we were playing off the excitement of being overseas," said Head Coach Keith Byrnes. "By the third game I think all the traveling and sight-seeing had finally caught up with us and we just didn't have the legs to compete at that level."

"The focus of this trip wasn't to win all four games; that would be a little unrealistic considering we only had five or six practices together as a team," Byrnes added. "I saw many positives on the field from our performances, and the amount of time we spent together as a team was priceless; all the traveling, sight-seeing, eating meals and just spending the nights talking and hanging out with each other really brought the guys closer together."

The team toured and shopped in the city of Glasgow, spent an afternoon in the city of Edinburgh and toured the castle and the Royal Mile. The team did more sight-seeing at some local shops and had a guided tour of Celtic Park, home of the Celtic Soccer team, the most storied franchise in Scottish soccer history.

The Bobcats capped their trip by attending the Celtic vs. Dundee United match in front of a sellout crowd of 67,000 fans and saw Celtic claim a 2-0 victory.

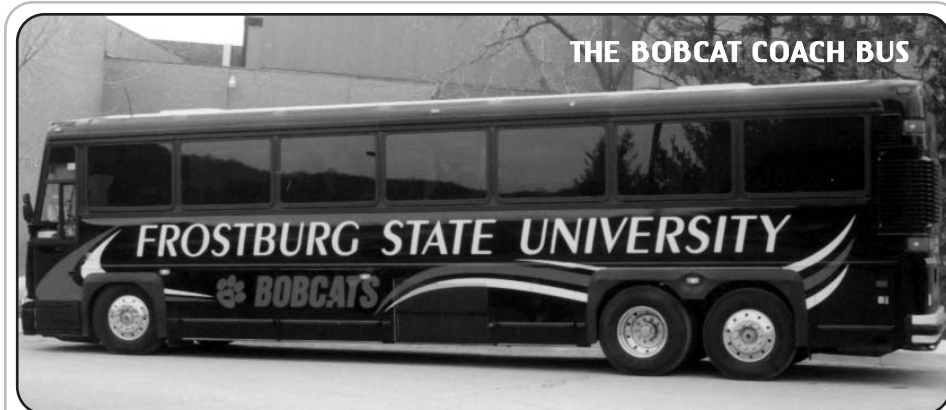
